Hello Tarras, Let's Talk Rubbish!

Tarras properties are not charged for rubbish collection on our rates bill.

The **\$73.98c** we are charged is a waste minimization fee.

This covers recycling, policy development and closed landfill monitoring.

The **\$8** for the Orange Rubbish Bag covers collection and disposal costs.

Every property within a wheelie bin collection zone (eg Cromwell) is charged **\$475.30c.** This includes the \$73.98c charge.

So how do we compare with Cromwell?


Each Cromwell property pays \$401.32 for disposal of rubbish. That would equate to **50** orange rubbish bags for each Tarras property.


If you use less than 50 orange rubbish bags a year then you are winning!


Gets Ready and we'll get ready for emergencies together
