

On Wednesday 19th October Tarras students participated in the Queenstown Polyfest. Only 2 of the current students performed back at Polyfest 2019 so this was a very exciting time for the new kapa haka members. Students took to the large stage at Queenstown Event Centre and performed the school karakia and the waiata, Ngoi Ngoi. Thank you to all the parents who supported the transport and cheered from the crowd, Tarras School was well represented. Students are already practising more waiata to add to their repertoire for 2023.

Year 3 - 6 students have been doing some work in our skink garden to clear the way for some of the previously planted shrubs and the schist rocks. Skinks have been spotted sunbathing on the rocks and scurrying through the long grass. Students have chosen to keep this area quite natural to ensure our wild skinks stick around. There is one small piece of fencing left to do, if you have a roll of chicken wire hanging about the students would happily take this off your hands. Year 0 - 2 have de-headed all our daffodils and are looking forward to next spring already when they will see them pop back up.

The school garden area is very large and it is a potential idea that this becomes more of a local community garden to ensure the area is well used and benefits a wider group of people.
