TARRAS COMMUNITY PLAN UPDATE

Near the end of 2021, a community values survey was distributed to the residents of Tarras, seeking your views on what is important to you as someone who lives, stays or owns property in Tarras. We are providing another opportunity for you to fill in this survey, to make sure that we hear from as many people as possible.

The survey askes what is special about Tarras, what you value and what you want Tarras to be known for in the future. Your response will help set a direction for the future by informing a new Tarras Community Plan.

The survey will close on Friday 30th of September, when the data will be analysed and presented back to the community at two workshops to be held at the Tarras Hall. These workshops are a chance for you to come together as a community and set a vision and action plan for the future. The first of these workshops will be held on Tuesday 18 October at 5.00pm, and the other will be held on Saturday 5 *November at 4.00pm*, and will include a sausage sizzle! We have tried to select two very different times so that most people will have a chance to attend one or the other.

We will analyze the data from this survey separately from the first time it was sent out, so don't worry if you can't remember if you have already filled it in or not – we want to hear from you!

This is a community-led process, supported by Central Otago District Council.
