ELDER FLOWER CORDIAL



1 kg sugar

6 cups boiling water

4 medium lemons (2 if you want less lemon flavour)

30 large flower heads: shake to remove insects, do not wash.

60-80g citric acid

Step 1:

Place sugar in large container with lid. Pour over boiling water, stir till dissolved. Cool before adding finely grated rind of lemons. Add lemons thickly sliced. Add citric acid and stir. Add flower heads, stir & leave to steep for 48 hours.

Step 2:

Strain through fine muslin cloth. Pour into clean bottles. Seal, store in a cool dark place, or freeze in plastic bottles.



TREES FOR TARRAS Cornus 'Eddie's White Wonder'

This dogwood grows to a small tree and thrives in our climate, preferring a moist, well-drained, sheltered position.

It is a magnificent sight in spring with large creamy-white flowers, and the foliage colours spectacularly in autumn with shades of red and orange.



KAI PACKAGE: CREAMY CORN & RICE ONE-POT

1. Boil 2 cups water in a pot • 1 cup rice (or packet pre-cooked rice)

OUR KĀREAREA ARE PART OF TARRAS - please help keep them safe...

These magnificent birds are not only a treasured part of our landscape but also a protected native species. Sadly, reports of harm to Kārearea have surfaced, reminding us how vital it is to respect and protect them.

KNOW THE LAW: Under the Wildlife Act 1953, it is illegal to hunt or kill native species such as the Kārearea. Offenders can face penalties of up to two years in prison or fines of up to \$10,000. The Department of Conservation is responsible for prosecuting these offences. Let's all do our part to ensure our Kārearea continue to soar over Tarras for generations to come.

There will be no church service at the Tarras Church on Sunday, 2 November 2025, while renovations are being completed.


