






Wildlife and TB in Otago

OSPRI's TBfree programme aims to eradicate bovine TB from New Zealand.

Possums are the main carriers, spreading the disease to herds. TB disappears when possum numbers are kept very low (about one per 10 hectares for five years). This year we're working across large areas of Otago (see map).



If we're not in your area, you can still help by controlling possums with baiting, trapping, or spotlighting - winter crops, trees and gardens are good places to set traps. When contacted, please present your animals for TB testing.

Testing frequency depends on your risk level, which may be based on location, nearby wildlife, trading history, or policy changes.

Accurate farm and animal records are vital. Through NAIT, please ensure:

- Your farm has both a NAIT and TB herd number
- Location details and land parcels are recorded
- Animals are tagged, registered, and have a birth date
- Movements off-farm are recorded within 48 hours

TB can be stressful for farmers and communities. OSPRI and the Rural Support Trust are here to help. For questions or concerns, contact info@ospri. co.nz or call 0800 482 463.



TARRAS FIRE BRIGADE

With the onset of spring with its sometimes unpredictable weather please take care.

This month has been quieter, with only two callouts - both vegetation fires. One was tanker support for the Luggate Brigade, and the other just today

It may seem unusual to be attending vegetation fires in winter, but frost-cured grass is just as flammable as dry summer grass. Today's fire was caused by discarded ash - a timely reminder that ash can stay hot much longer than expected.

The Mt Alpha fire near Wanaka, caused the same way, ended up costing hundreds of thousands of dollars in helicopter time.
